You can choose what happens when you are pregnant and when you give birth.



A birth plan can help you get ready to give birth.

It can include:

- How you want to give birth
- · Where you want to give birth
- When you want to give birth
- What you choose to help you cope with pain
- Who you want with you when you give birth.





Your midwife will read through your birth plan with you.

This can help them understand what you need.




If you want someone with you when you give birth, they might need advice.

If you do not speak English you have the right to ask for someone to help you understand what is happening.


You can ask for an interpreter when you call the hospital to let them know you are in labour.



You might need help to give birth.


Your midwife will talk to you about how the baby will come out.





Your midwife will ask you to agree to things before they are done. This includes:

- Assisted delivery
- Induction
- · Having contractions increased.



There are three types of assisted delivery. These can help your baby to be born.

They include:

- Forceps delivery
- Ventouse delivery
- · Caesarean section.

An induction is when your care team helps you start to give birth.

You can choose to have this if your baby is late or your pregnancy is dangerous for you or your baby.

You might have to pay for maternity care if:


- You have only lived in the UK for a short time
- You are only planning on staying in the UK for a short time.

You do not have to pay when you receive care. You can set up a payment plan.

You still have a right to care when you need it even if you cannot pay upfront.


